Subject: REACH Compliance Regulation (EC) No. 1907/2006  
Published Candidate Lists, Annex XIV and Annex XVII.

Dear Valued Customer,

In 2006, the EU passed the above reference regulation, known as REACH, concerning the production and use of chemical substances. Under REACH, all companies manufacturing or importing chemical substances into the European Union in quantities of one ton or more need to register the substances. It was effective June 2007 with a phased in implementation.

Gibbs Interwire is a distributor of metal products, providing value added services of slitting, edging and oscillating. Under our reading of the regulation and the additional communications from the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA), we believe that the wire and strip products we sell do not need to be registered in their existing form. Nor do we have to register based on the fact that these products contain elements such as nickel, chromium, carbon, etc., of which we are not releasing.<sup>1</sup>

In communication with our vendors, we have been advised that the products they supply to us do not contain any significant amounts of the 251 chemical compounds referenced on the List of Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) through its latest release on 11/05/2025. We believe the material supplied to you from Gibbs Interwire is in full compliance with this regulation. We will continue to monitor and update the REACH requirements in conjunction with our vendors.
